City of Sebastopol Demographics Prepared by City Planning Department

This demographic report is a breakdown of the population of Sebastopol. The report covers an array of important topics including total population, age, gender, race/ethnicity, housing and income. Each of these topics is an important ingredient in the makeup of Sebastopol; this report provides knowledge and understanding about Sebastopol and its people.

Total Population


Total population is the number of people who consider Sebastopol their primary residence. It does not include persons residing here less than half the year, or persons who are here temporarily. The data was collected by the U.S. Census Bureau for the 2010 census.

The population of Sebastopol increased at a steady rate over the last four censuses, (1970-2000) however in this most recent census (2010) the population of Sebastopol has experienced its first decrease in population, from 7,774 people in 2000 to 7,379 people in 2010. This was in spite of a modest increase in housing of 144 dwelling units.


Although Sebastopol showed a 5.1% decrease in population, both Sonoma County and California experienced an increase in population at 5.2% and 9.1% respectively. Sebastopol population shifts are running counter to broader trends.

Sonoma County Population Estimates




Age Distribution

The median age of Sebastopol has increased from the 2000 census. The median age has increased from 41.5 to 46.1 years. This means that the town's population is getting older. It also means that young people (20-39 years) are less in abundance within the city. The population of 20-39 year olds was 1,638 according to the 2000 census; the population has dropped by more than 200 bringing the population of 20-39 years old to 1,432 in 2010. The population of 40-49 years has also decreased form 1,468 in 2000 to 978 in 2010. In contrast, there has been an increase in population with in the 50-69 age groups. The population of 50-59 years has increased by more than 300, from 1,095 in 2000 to 1,311 in 2010. The population of 60-69 years has increased by 560, from 499 in 2000 to 1059 in 2010.

This age increase, coupled with the population decrease, suggests that young people and younger households may be shifting out of the city. This could be caused by their lack of ability to locate affordable housing in the city, lack of employment opportunities, or other factors. Meanwhile the population of people closer to retirement age has increased, suggesting an aging population, and/or people may be moving into the city for retirement-related reasons.



Another cause for the decrease in Sebastopol's population may be from children of baby boomers relocating out of Sebastopol. In 2000 the 10-19 age group was 1,185. Ten years later in 2010 the 20-29 age group was 647, a drop in population of 538, which may be partly related to a generation of young people leaving Sebastopol for educational or career opportunities.



Population by Gender

In each of the last two censuses (1990 and 2000) the female population is larger than the male population. In 1990 there were 420 more females than males, and in 2000 there were 812 more females then males. This trend holds true for the 2010 census where again the female population is larger than the male, with a difference of 823 more females than males.




Population by Race/Ethnicity


Race and ethnicity of a population is self-determined, meaning that individuals identify their own race or ethnicity in the census. There are six race categories: American Indian and Alaska Native, Asian, Black/African American, White, Hawaiian, Other Pacific Islander, Hispanic or Latino. There two less descriptive categories; Some Other Race and Two or more races.

The total quantity of each race/ethnicity category changed slightly from the 2000 census. In the 2010 census every category has experienced an increase with the exception of the white category which diminished in size. However despite the change in total population and






Housing in Sebastopol


Housing units are categorized as single and multiple family dwellings including mobile homes and other dwelling units located within the boundaries of the city. Sebastopol is home to 3,465 housing units, an increase of 144 units from the 2000 census. The total number of occupied housing units is 3,276, an increase from 3,250 from 2000. The occupation of the housing units is split between owner-occupied 1,734, a decrease from 1,818 in 2000, and renter-occupied 1,542, an increase from 1,432 in 2000.

There appears to be a change in the housing unit tends in Sebastopol. People appear to be moving away from owning homes and switching to renter status. This is potentially due to the construction of several multi-family unit properties. The housing change is also likely related to the current economic condition. An increase in vacant units may also be related to the general economy, including foreclosure and short sale.



The median household and median family income has been increasing from the time of the 1970 census. The median household and median family income for Sebastopol in 2010 was \$61,753/\$74,698 compared to \$60,392/\$68,909 for all

California 1n 2010. Sebastopol has somewhat higher incomes and greater spending power then the rest of California, although lower then Sonoma County. A higher proportion of renter households affect Sebastopol's income statistics.

Like Sebastopol Sonoma County's median household and median family income for 2010 is larger than California, this means that Sonoma County is one of the wealthier counties in California.



These demographic changes have important implications not only for the local economy, but also for schools, community services, and the character of Sebastopol. The sheer decline in population generally is believed to translate into less economic activity. In addition, older persons have different consumer spending patterns and need different services than younger persons. Sebastopol schools are facing challenges with declining enrollment necessitating school closures.
